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[49m 38s] Hubbard and Scientology believe that if you get physically ill, [...] the only possible reason for that is that you have a suppressive person in your life. [...] So a lot of the time what happens is that a kid in Scientology school — this happened to me many times —

will get sick you know, you will get a cold and you will stay home for two days. And when you get back to school, you got to sit down with the Ethics Officer and they say, "Now I want you to write down who the suppressive person in your life is."

And... You know you're ten years old, you're eleven years old. And you go, "I don't know, I don't know," and they say there have to be a suppressive person in your life. Hubbard said that the only reason you just got sick is that because there is a suppressive who have been

upsetting you recently.

I had an experience when I was ten years old, I wrote down the name of the last person I got an argument with. And I found out a few weeks later that that girl — she was eleven — got thrown out of school, because I had named her a suppressive person [...], wrote down her name because that was the only thing that was going to get me out of that Ethics Office, and she got kicked out. [...]
